#### Cockpit - overview



- 1 Door handle
  - Locks the vehicle centrally
  - Unlocks the vehicle centrally
- (2) Seat functions



### Combination switch - lighting functions

- High-beam headlamps or Adaptive Highbeam Assist Plus
- 2 Turn signal, right
- 3 High-beam flasher 4 Turn signal, left

#### Activating/deactivating

- 1) Switches on with the current speed or calls up the last set speed
- **Deactivates Active Distance Assist** DISTRONIC

#### Changing the speed

- Increases the speed or stores the current
- Decreases the speed or stores the current 4 speed
- (5) Increases the specified minimum distance (6) Reduces the specified minimum distance
- Active Distance Assist DISTRONIC maintains a constant speed which has been stored. The lowest speed that can be set is 20 mph (30 km/h).

**Active Distance Assist DISTRONIC** 

You can change the set speed:

- ▶ 1 mph (1 km/h) step: Briefly press the lever up or down.
- 5 mph (10 km/h) step: Press the lever up or down past the pressure point.

When Active Distance Pilot DISTRONIC is activated, one or two segments in the set speed range light up in the speedometer.

Using the controller on the DISTRONIC lever, you can change the specified minimum distance to the vehicle in front. The specified minimum distance depends on the currently driven speed.

#### Climate control control panel Defrosts the windshield

- ZONE Sets climate zones separately
- Activates or deactivates the cooling function of climate control.
- Defrosts the rear window LXX REAR
- Reduces the airflow 88
- Increases the airflow \*\*
- **OFF** Completely activates or deactivates climate control.

Sets the air distribution Sets the air distribution

- AUTO Sets climate control to automatic mode Air-recirculation mode
- The air in the interior will be recirculated.
- In air-recirculation mode, the windows can fog up more quickly. Residual heat with the engine off

# General notes

Climate control regulates the temperature and the humidity in the vehicle interior and filters undesirable substances out of the air. Climate control is only operational when the engine is running. Optimum operation is only achieved when the side windows and the roof are closed.

To prevent the windows from fogging up, please observe the following information:

- **OFF** Switches off climate control only briefly
- Switch on air-recirculation mode only briefly
- A/c Switch on the cooling function. In warm weather, the air inside the vehicle will be cooled. This function also dries the air inside the vehicle.
- If necessary, briefly switch on the windshield defroster.

#### **Voice Control System**

#### Starting a dialog

The Voice Control System allows you to comfortably operate the majority of the multimedia system's functions.

To say a command: Press the 3 button and say a command after the audible signal.

#### **Voice Control System help functions**

- General information:
- Say the "Help voice control" command.
- Help for the current function: Say the "Help" command.
- Help for a specific system: Say the help command for the desired system, e.g. "Help telephone".

If you press the  $\fill$  button, the possible commands are shown in a help window. You can switch off the display of this help window in the multimedia system.

#### **Examples**

#### **Navigation commands**

- A dialog for entering a destination in the navigation system will be started. Thereafter, say the destination address.
- "Nearest gas station' Many more categories for points of interest are available, e.g. restaurant or tourist attraction.
- "Enter destination"
- "Navigate to John Doe" Start route guidance to a contact from your address book.

#### Telephone commands


- "Call John Doe" The telephone number of a stored contact is dialed.
- "New message" A dialog for entering a text message (SMS) will be started.

#### Audio commands

- "Station Z100" If you are listening to the radio, you can say the name of a station to which you would like to listen.
- "Search for music" A dialog in which you can search through your music files will be started.

#### Example image: COMAND **Creating favorites**

- 1) Adds a new favorite
- (2) Renames a selected favorite (3) Moves a selected favorite
- 4 Deletes a selected favorite

For rapid access to functions which are called up frequently, you can create up to 20 favorites.

#### Adding a pre-defined favorite Press the \* button.

- The favorites are displayed.
  - Slide the controller down. The menu bar is shown.
- Select Reassign and use the controller to select a category.
- Select a favorite and store it in the desired position.

#### Adding your own favorite


